Ticket Time Update: Two Weeks Left To Sell Tickets

Happy Thanksgiving week, everybody! We hope you enjoy dinner with your friends and family on Thursday and shopping on Friday, but we hope you'll have more on your minds than turkey, football, and shopping this week. As of tonight, we're only 18 days away from our first performance, and we still have some seats to fill for both shows. That means that we really need to keep promoting our concerts and selling tickets! Please be sure to grab posters and postcards to distribute in the community as you're doing your holiday shopping this week, and don't forget to ask your friends and family about giving and getting the gift of music this holiday season by purchasing GCCC concert tickets.

Last week, there was a lot of good buzz (sorry, I couldn't resist) amongst the singers about the season ticket raffle prize we announced. In case you missed it, the winning entry for our season ticket raffle will receive a gift basket from Heritage Honey of Ventura worth \$100 one honey of a prize, if I do say so myself. (Last honey pun for tonight, I promise.) All you have to do to earn a raffle ticket is to sell or purchase a season ticket between now and the December concerts; the drawing will be held immediately after our final performance. Season tickets make a great stocking stuffer for a fan of the arts - season ticket holders receive tickets to all three of our concerts and get to sit in our special VIP section, all for only \$45 for adults and \$12 for kids. That's a savings of \$9 over purchasing tickets individually at the regular price!

If individual tickets for the December concert are more your friends' speed, they're available for sale, at \$18 each for adults, \$15 for students and seniors 65 or better, and \$5 for children 12 and under. Francine and her ticket team are also still offering the option of checking out tickets for singers to sell, but don't delay – remember, proceeds from checked-out tickets and unsold tickets need to be returned to Francine and her team by the final week of rehearsals, which is just two weeks away. Whatever tickets you'd like, and however you'd like to sell them, Francine and her ticket team are ready to provide them to you!

Tickets can be purchased by cash, check, money order, and via credit or debit card using PayPal; you also have the option to pick up tickets at the time of purchase, or request they be held at "will call" for pick up on the performance dates. Groupmuse Holiday Chamber Music Concert, November 30th

If you've been reading *Notes and Measures* for a while, you know that we love to promote other arts and music events in Ventura County, especially if those events involve our fellow singers. Well, recently one of our singers told us about how she's participating in a website that allows her to host chamber music events in her own home! Jaimie Goulding will be holding an event in less than a couple of weeks, and we hope you'll take the opportunity to join her for an evening of wonderful music.

On Friday, November 30th, Jaimie will be hosting a chamber music concert through a web-based organization called Groupmuse. That way Groupmuse works is that participants agree to host a concert in their home, and the organization helps to the host to arrange for the musicians and an audience for the performance. On the night of the performance, the host provides wine, beer and water, but invites guests to bring their own drinks if they'd like. Some chair and sofa + stair seating is made available, but guests can also bring their own folding chair, blanket or cushion. During the concert, the host passes the hat to collect a minimum \$10 contribution for the musicians playing at the event.

Okay, now that we know what a Groupmuse event is, what will the musicians be playing at Jaimie's event? Jaimie and her group are in a holiday mood, and want to share with some piano and cello duo magic with contemporary Russian flavor; the concert will feature pianist Jacopo Giacopuzzi along with cellist Georgy Gusev in a program that will include pieces by Rachmaninoff, Shostakovich, and Kasputin.
